Document Public Comments:

- a. Will Meurer: The online learning plan continues to seem appropriate. Things have gotten worse in the county since last month's board meeting. There are currently 70 COVID-19 patients at UM hospital. The number of daily cases is around 100 per day in the county, but the rate is low as a percentage of the population. The vaccine news is more positive, but it will likely be a while before it can be distributed to those at lower risk. The conditions in the county are not currently improving. Rahul asked if there are also breakthroughs in treatment of COVID-19. Will answered that there is a newer antibody treatment that is promising early in a COVID-19 infection. There are also some treatments for people in the hospital. Nicole noted that we are still at Phase 4, but there is a dashboard from the health department that has Washtenaw County rated as E, which is the worst.
